The **“CREATE FUND”** was started to help learn more about immune-mediated encephalitis, educate clients about this disease, and support the diagnosis and treatment of encephalitis.

The costs of the initial tests and treatment for encephalitis can be more than \$2,500.00, especially if there is an MRI, prolonged hospitalization or repeat spinal taps.

One of the primary goals of the **“CREATE Fund”** is to assist pet owners in defraying the costs associated with the diagnosis and treatment of Idiopathic Encephalitis.

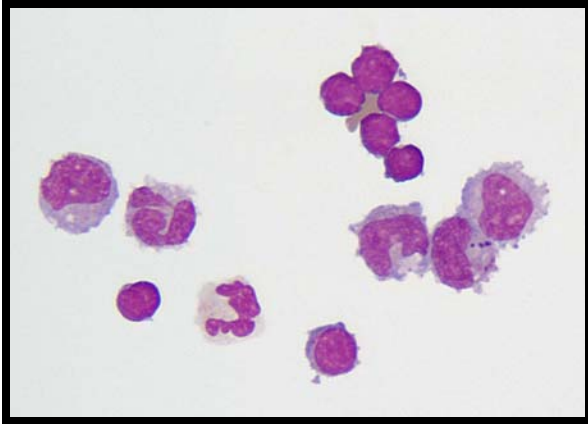


Photo of Inflammatory Cerebral Spinal Fluid

- *Retrospective evaluation of encephalitis therapies and associated side-effects.*



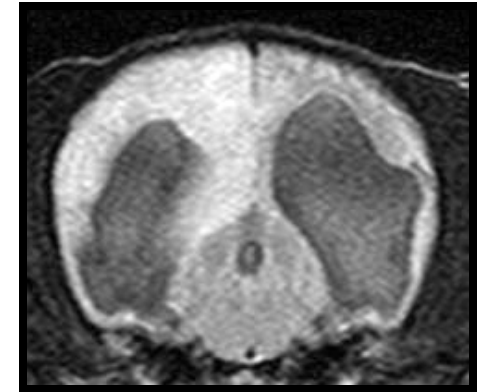
The “CREATE FUND”
